# BANNERS

Choose one (or both) of the templates to follow for making your banner. Try to find heavier card stock paper to use if you can. You can print these templates, cut them out and trace them onto your card stock or print them straight onto your card stock paper, then cut them out. The "x" in each corner is where you will punch a hole and string them together.

Take a moment to think about your family. What are some things you love to enjoy together? Do you have a family book that you read together? Do you like to eat a special food together? Do you have an activity that you do as a family? If your family had a theme or mascot, what would it be?


Design your banner to reflect these family themes. Your banner should be something that represents your unique, beautiful family.
